Carlo Carlesi graduated in Computer Science and has worked since 1970 at the IEI (now ISTI) of the Italian National Research Council in Pisa. His interest has been concentrated in many software engineering fields such as: Data Base Systems, Software quality and testing, Administration and UNIX system management, Network security and management, Data Publication, Open Science, Digital Library [Management] Systems and Architectures. He was Head of the "Information Technology Security Service" of the Institute and has participated in many national and international projects, among the most recent: Italian Project for Research in the Antarctica - South Pole Project with the aim to create a Multidisciplinary Integrated Information System. Other of the projects in which he participated include: ERCIM Technical Reference Digital Library - ETRDL Project; PUMA (PUBlication MAnagement) a software infrastructure for the management of the institutional/disciplinary archives of the published and grey literature of the CNR Institutes. He is currently a collaborator of the InfraScience Lab of the CNR ISTI and is involved in the GreyGuide Repository and Portal to Good Practices and Resources in Grey Literature.
