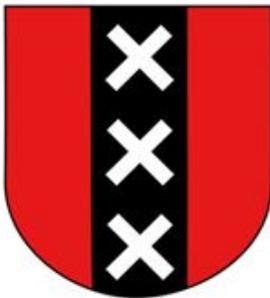

GreyWorks 2016 is the 7th workshop offered in this series and will be held at the University of Amsterdam Library. The workshop entitled 'Leveraging Grey Resources' incorporates a training module developed in cooperation with a team of information professionals active in the field of Grey Literature. The training comprises a step-by-step, hands-on approach in the assessment of grey literature resources sustained by information communities either in government, academics, business or industry. The stepwise approach implemented throughout the training is in line with the model GreyNet uses in its own assessment of sustained information resources provided its stakeholders and the communities they serve.

The workshop is conducted by Dominic Farace, founder and director of the Grey Literature Network Service. Farace is program planner for the international conference series on grey literature, book and journal editor, guest lecturer, author, and recipient of the Victorine van Schaick Prize 2008 (Netherlands).

Leveraging Grey Resources is geared to information professionals and practitioners involved in areas of policy development and the management of information resources and services.

Participants stand to gain a clearer understanding of the stakeholders whom they serve; what constitutes sustained information resources; the importance of tracking developments with regard to these resources and their user statistics; recognizing the value of survey research and the analysis of its results; as well as the preparedness to offer recommendations in the assessment of information resources within one's organization – whereby the outcome can influence decision making and allow for needed change.

The Workshop Program offers a mix of formal presentation, participant exercises, and informal discussion.
